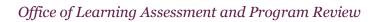

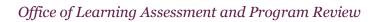



## **OVERALL RECOMMENDATIONS**

Across program learning outcomes (PLOs), BA Social and Criminal Justice students exceeded most of the acceptable targets for the 2011-12 assessment measures. In comparing the 2010-2011 BA Social and Criminal Justice targets to the 2011-2012 BA Social and Criminal Justice targets, the findings indicate that all of the 2011-2012 BA Social and Criminal Justice results have moved towards the Acceptable Target benchmarks.

## Office of Learning Assessment and Program Review



4 out of the 5 Discussion Thread measures for the BA Social and Criminal Justice 2011-2012 assessment cycle exceeded both the acceptable targets and the ideal targets. The one Discussion Thread measure that did not meet the acceptable target was in the capstone course CRJ 422 and was aligned to PLO 4. All other measures for the BA Social and Criminal Justice 2011-2012 assessment cycle exceeded the set acceptable targets and are approaching the set ideal targets.

It is recommended that College of Liberal Arts Faculty review the assessment plans (including measures used and targets set) in preparation for the 2012-13 assessment cycle. In particular, Faculty may want to review targets set for assignments in the courses using Waypoint discussion posts, and all survey measures to ensure that these targets remain appropriate and meaningful.
