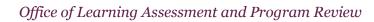

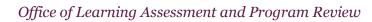

Action details:	MHA614 shared similar competencies as MHA620. Therefore, the decision was made to remove MHA614 from the course listing. Faculty voted to add a global healthcare course in its place, as detailed below: • The courses in the curriculum did not provide an in-depth comparative analysis of the U.S. healthcare system and other health systems around the world. Program faculty believe an analysis of cross-national health systems will serve to place the performance of the U.S. healthcare system in an international context and highlight opportunities for cross-national learning to improve health system performance. MHA630 Global Health Systems was developed and launched as part of the required courses in the curriculum. MHA630 reflects on the historical evolution of health care models and policies in the United States and abroad contrasting the impact of health and disease on a nation's economy, security, culture, and global presence. Health data and health systems measures ranging from health status and non-medical determinants of health and health care resources and utilization will be examined to highlight areas where health systems could be improved and to inform public policy. Health care administrators have a responsibility to the global community and must
