Credit Evaluation Guide of ACE Credit Recommendations for Sophia Learning

The University of Arizona Global Campus (UAGC) recognizes the uniqueness of each student's experience and realizes learning takes place in a variety of environments. The American Council on Education (ACE) provides a means for recommending credit for exams, courses, trainings, and/or experience acquired outside of a traditional university classroom setting.

Sophia Learning's exams, courses, trainings, and/or experience that carry ACE recommended credit have been evaluated for transfer applicability at UAGC.

Students are responsible for requesting their Sophia Learning transcripts.

Transfer Provisions

Students must complete 120 credits to obtain a bachelor's degree. A maximum of 90 combined non-traditional learning, UAGC prior learning, and transfer credits may be accepted and applied toward the 120-credit requirement. Within the 90-credit maximum, a maximum of 75 credits of non-traditional credit, including UAGC prior learning, may be applied toward degree completion.

Official transfer credit evaluation takes place once a student is enrolled at UAGC, and all official transcripts have been received.

Additional Information

- All recommendations on this transfer guide show the current course equivalency at the time the guide was developed. Students should confirm any ACE or NCCRS recommendation is still active. Previous versions of each offering may transfer differently based on the content at the time it was completed.
- Credit will only be considered if the student successfully passes the exam, course, training, and/or experience with the ACE or NCCRS recommended passing score.
- Exams, courses, trainings, and/or experience that meet more than one General Education requirement can only be applied to one General Education requirement, unless the recommendation is for additional credit.
 - Recommendations of 3 credits may meet multiple subject areas or courses but can only be applied once.
 - Recommendations of 6 or more credits may meet multiple subject areas or courses where a minimum of 3 credits may be applied to each subject area or course until the total recommended credits have been applied.
- Multiple recommendations may meet the same General Education requirement. Only one recommendation with the required credit is needed to satisfy the requirement.
- Recommendations marked with an asterisk (*) must be combined with additional courses in the same subject area to satisfy the credit requirement.
- Recommendations being transferred to meet the Information Literacy Core Competency requirement, the Digital Literacy Competency requirement, or any computer-specific course must have been completed within the last 5 years.
- In some instances, lower-division credits marked with cross (+) may be applied for upper-division credits. They will not apply to the upper-division residency requirement. Additional upper-division courses may be required.
- Unless otherwise noted, exams, courses, trainings, and/or experience not listed and deemed to be college level or equivalent by ACE or NCCRS will be evaluated for elective credit. Recommendations from ACE or NCCRS at the vocational level will not be considered for credit at UAGC.
- Credit may only be applied to the same degree level (undergraduate, graduate) as the incoming transfer credit.
