Degree Focus:

The Bachelor of Arts in Healthcare Administration program is a career-focused degree completion program designed to prepare students for leadership and administrative roles across the healthcare industry. The program equips learners with practical, workforce-ready knowledge and skills applicable to hospitals, clinics, long-term care facilities, public health organizations, insurance providers, and other health-related settings. Through an interdisciplinary and integrated curriculum that reflects the complexity of today's health care environment, students gain a strong foundation in health care operations, organizational leadership, and systems management. Coursework emphasizes real-world application and professional skill development in areas such as health care leadership, financial management, strategic planning, health policy and regulation, ethics, cultural competency, human resource management, public health systems, accreditation standards, and quality improvement. The program is designed for individuals currently working in healthcare or seeking to enter or advance within the field. Graduates are prepared to contribute effectively to improving organizational performance, patient outcomes, and overall healthcare delivery systems.

Program Outcomes:

Health Care Administration major graduates will be able to:

- Assess the application of legal and ethical standards within the healthcare delivery system;
- Apply cultural and sociodemographic information to healthcare decision making processes;
- Describe the impact of regulatory requirements on healthcare service provision;
- Evaluate the major financing systems of the U.S. healthcare to inform professional practice;
- Assess industry frameworks to identify forces driving change in the healthcare delivery system;
- Distinguish issues influencing the planning and delivery of community and public health services; and
- Apply leadership principles to professional practice within the healthcare delivery system.
