Total Required Credits for Bachelor’s Degree 120 Must include 30 upper division credits.

Applicants to this program must have earned a nursing (hospital) diploma or associate degree in nursing from an approved accredited college or university including the following coursework or equivalent: Microbiology (with lab).

Applicants must possess an active, unrestricted license to practice as a Registered Nurse or its equivalent in at least one U.S. state. All students must maintain this licensure throughout the program of study. Failure to do so will result in dismissal from the program. Students are responsible for informing the University of Arizona Global Campus of any change to the status of their RN license. In addition, UAGC may perform routine, periodic validations of student RN licenses to ensure compliance with this requirement.
